Motherhood

- changing attitude
 - male participation in the care of their children
 - men's parental leave
 - women's career
 - postponing starting a family
 - surrogate motherhood
 - social status
 - state financial support

Analysis of the Lemma Motherhood

- corpus analysis (corpus SYN2015)
- journalistic texts
 - 2010-2014
- frequency analysis
- collocation analysis
- concordance analysis
- thematic categorisation of the topic
 - corpus driven approach


Frequency analysis

- size of the corpus
 - approximately 33 million tokens
- frequency of the lemma “motherhood”
 - 236 tokens
 - 5.49 tokens per million
 - its rank in the interval $r = <11,086; 11,126>$
 - 363,819 lemmas in the corpus

Frequency analysis

- text types
 - journalism: 5.94 i.p.m.
 - expert literature: 5.89 i.p.m.
 - fiction: 3.63 i.p.m.
- genres within journalism
 - lifestyle: 29.38 i.p.m.
 - social life: 13.57 i.p.m.
 - society: 10.25 i.p.m.
 - ...
 - newspapers: 2.77 i.p.m.

Collocation analysis



Collocation analysis

- the collocation span L5–P5
 - (i.e. 5 positions to the left, 5 to the right) from the KWIC (key word in context)
- the minimum frequency of a collocate in the corpus = 3
- the minimum frequency of a collocate in context = 3

Discourse categories

- surrogacy
 - *surrogate (náhradní), law (zákon), Czechia (Česko), legal (legální), treat (upravovat)*
- career
 - *career (kariéra), woman (žena), job (práce), work (pracovat), harmonize (skloubit)*
- joy
 - *enjoy (užívat / užít si), joy (radost), great (skvělý)*
- changes
 - *change (změnit)*

Discourse categories

- family relations
 - *child (dítě), mother (matka), life (život), role (role), husband (manžel), family (rodina), love (láska), husband / man and wife (manželé)*
- finances
 - *financial (peněžitý), help (pomoc), right (nárok)*
- aktivity
 - *active (aktivní), movement (hnutí)*
- time
 - *period (doba), late (pozdní), year (rok), now (ted'), postponing (odsouvání), postpone (odkládat), last (poslední), time (čas)*
